2025 Call for Submissions

Submission Categories

Paper can be submitted in the following subject area categories:

The above categories may be modified based on submissions received. Accepted papers will be grouped into panels thematically and by discipline.

Students should discuss the choice of the applicable categories with their faculty mentors and select them in the online Submission Portal.

Selection Process

A panel of three scholars will select three papers from each category to be presented at the conference. Additional papers will be selected for a poster session.

Approach

The methods and tools of research/analysis should be appropriate to the specific discipline.

All submissions must show the results of research, reflection, and an original perspective.

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Maximum length of 5,000 words (excluding biography) for papers and 20 minutes for presentations. After the last panel presentation, 30 minutes will be reserved for questions from the panel judge and the audience

Format

- 1. The paper must be typed in Arial font size 12, double-spaced, with 1-inch margins.
- 2. Pages must be numbered with Arabic numerals in the upper-right hand corner.
- 3. Name of the student and college must **NOT** appear anywhere in the paper. Include the title of the paper at the top of the first page of the essay.
- 4. Please DO NOT include a title page. The title page will be generated separately in the Submissions Portal on the conference website.
- 5. The Beacon Conference values student's authentic voices, and all work submitted must be completed by the student. Using generative artificial (AI) to produce text is **prohibited**. By submitting a paper, the student agrees that it will be checked for originality by the conference organizers using standard software.
- 6. Sources must be documented according to the guidelines of the discipline (MLA, APA, etc).

Submission Process

Eligibility is determined by the student's home institution. Papers must be submitted through the Submission Portal at The Beacon Conference.

Deadline: March 1, 2025. Receipt confirmation will be sent to the student and mentor.

Award Criteria

Outstanding paper and presentations for each category will be selected based on and originality of research, written work, and oral presentation.

Awards

\$100 will be awarded to the author of the outstanding paper in each category.

The student's faculty mentor will also receive an award.
